Indiana University Organ Chair Janette Fishell to perform at Cathedral

A recitalist and teacher of international standing

(St. Paul, Minn.) Organist Janette Fishell will perform a concert on the historic, newly refurbished pipe organs at the Cathedral of Saint Paul on Thursday, Sept. 25 at 7:30 p.m. Fishell is a Professor of Music and Chair of the Organ Department at Indiana University's Jacobs School of Music in Bloomington, Indiana. She is the fourth of five organists to perform in the *Inaugural Year of Organ Concerts*, marking the completion of the \$3.4 million project on the E. M. Skinner and Æolian-Skinner pipe organs by Quimby Pipe Organs of Missouri. The organ restoration project was a community-wide effort and drew support from 800 individual donors. The Cathedral of Saint Paul is located at 239 Selby Avenue, at the corner of Summit Avenue in Saint Paul, Minn. Free parking is available in the Cathedral parking lots and the surrounding area.

The program – using both organs simultaneously and alone – will feature music of Petr Eben, J. S. Bach, Ethel Smith, Lionel Rogg and Louis Vierne, heard in the rich acoustic of the Cathedral.

Fishell holds a bachelor's and master's degree of music from Indiana University and earned her doctorate from Northwestern University in Chicago. In her career as a musician, Fishell has played some of the world's most renowned concert venues including Suntory Hall, Tokyo; King's College, Cambridge and Berlin's *Schauspielhaus*. She has been a featured recitalist and lecturer at five regional and five national conventions for the American Guild of Organists (AGO). Her performances have been recorded and nationally broadcasted by the BBC and *Pipedreams*.
