




## On GIVE MN Day -- Let the light shine in! Please help the Cathedral Heritage Foundation restore more windows



This year, fundraising efforts will be focused on restoring the iconic stained-glass windows created by leading American craftsmen of the early 20th century, including Charles Connick and Bancel La Farge. The windows they created, expressing timeless themes and images, were meant to last for centuries if cared for properly. Once the pure lead frames have been replaced with stronger lead alloy frames, the windows should be set for generations to come.

"A century ago, new Americans, from many backgrounds, religions, and cultures built this Beaux Arts masterpiece," said Mary Schaffner, CHF Board Chair. "It still inspires us -- if we work together for the common good, we can achieve wonderful results."


Artisans from Gaytee Palmer Stained Glass in Northeast Minneapolis will be doing the delicate work. You can help!

Giving levels:

- **\$50** Remove a stained-glass panel (22 panels per window) for transport.
- **\$100** Scrape old putty off the glass



We would like to have the windows on the main floor shining as brilliantly as the

- **\$250** Soak glass in soap in water to remove 100 years of accumulated grime.
- **\$500** Grout each panel to withstand another century in each frame!!
- **\$750** Polish the glass and lead to a brilliant shine.
- **\$1000** Transport back to Cathedral, climb scaffolding, and re-install in original frames.
- **\$8000** Restore one window, start-to-finish.
